# 4. BOLD, Community on the Rise

A Resolution approving and authorizing the Mayor to execute a BOLD Program

Agreement with Community on the Rise through the BOLD funding program to

implement a project to empower 5 women survivors of homelessness through the WHOLE program, full-time employment opportunity, and community partnership. The project will expand stable housing opportunities by launching a second Rent-to-HOME pathway and maintaining a current pathway, while simultaneously growing Community on the Rise's justice enterprise by placing recycled plastic products in 10 retail stores and tracking quarterly recycling totals to demonstrate measurable community and environmental impact, for a term of twelve (12) months, for an amount not to exceed \$75,740.00.

Agreement with Creed Foundation through the BOLD funding program to implement Creed Foundation's PACE (Providing Access to Capital Equality) Program, a 16-week business development curriculum designed for historically underserved small-business owners which closes critical gaps in financial literacy, credit

readiness, legal compliance, and operational capacity through group instruction and one-on-one mentorship, for a term of twelve (12) months, for an amount not to

exceed \$94,402.50.

priority neighborhoods in addition to providing quarterly trauma training for

the Capital Innovation Lab: Birmingham Inclusive Innovation Initiative which is

designed to eliminate barriers, strengthen workforce development, and support

small businesses by bringing together angel investor training, entrepreneurship

development for students and professionals, and a community-wide innovation

summit, for a term of twelve (12) months, for an amount not to exceed \$121,000.

### 9. BOLD, The Flourish Alabama

A Resolution approving and authorizing the Mayor to execute a BOLD Program Agreement with The Flourish Alabama through the BOLD funding program to implement a project entitled "The Ensley Creative Economy Initiative," which aims to transform Ensley, Birmingham, into a thriving arts district by leveraging public art, cultural programming, and community-driven design to create 50 jobs; to provide workforce development for more than 140 local students from Birmingham City Schools; to host events such as concerts, artist showcases, wellness programs; and to implement public art installations, thereby stimulating local businesses, attracting visitors, and creating economic opportunities for artists, for a term of twelve (12) months, for an amount not to exceed \$139,000.00.

A Resolution approving and authorizing the Mayor to execute a BOLD Program Agreement with The Bridge International through the BOLD funding program to allow The Bridge International to implement a hands-on workforce development and career exploration program at The Link Bham, its entrepreneur and training center for dislocated workers, disadvantaged residents, and entrepreneurs in Birmingham, to equip participants with practical skills and training that lead to entry level positions or enhance skills in high-demand trades such as HVAC, electrical work, building maintenance, plumbing and related fields, for a term of twelve (12) months, for an amount not to exceed \$140,172.16.

Agreement with The Pulse Finders, LLC through the BOLD funding program to

implement a comprehensive, community-centered emergency response training

program to improve cardiac arrest survival rates, reduce health disparities, and

create pathways to workforce development focusing on Birmingham's priority

neighborhoods, including North Birmingham, Smithfield, Ensley, and Woodlawn,

where residents face the greatest barriers to CPR training and emergency

preparedness, for a term of twelve (12) months, for an amount not to exceed

\$83,240.00.

wraparound support including life coaching, case management, transportation, valid

ID, and counseling in which participants will earn industry-recognized credentials,

complete internships with local employers, and receive 12 months of post-

graduation support to ensure job placement and retention, for a term of twelve (12)

months, for an amount not to exceed \$115,008.20.

A Resolution approving and authorizing the Mayor to execute a BOLD Program Agreement with Alabama Center for Employee Ownership, Inc. through the BOLD funding program to work with small businesses to keep good jobs in Birmingham, eliminate barriers to retirement for entrepreneurs and lead to wealth generation for workers by turning the "silver tsunami" of retiring small business owners into an opportunity for workers through workforce development, creative placemaking and hosting the People-First Development Conference which will equip attendees with a familiarity of how employee ownership drives development and a deep knowledge of the resources available for employee ownership conversion, for a

term of twelve (12) months, for an amount not to exceed \$93,055.00.

# 15. Breakthrough Birmingham

A Resolution approving and authorizing the Mayor to execute a BOLD Program Agreement with Breakthrough Birmingham through the BOLD funding program implement Breakthrough

Birmingham's Thrive Teacher Project which offers 1-to-1 coaching/mentorship to 1st and 2nd

year Birmingham teachers, and teachers are assigned a mentor/coach, a retired educator from

whom they receive weekly observations and coaching. The program focuses on improving

knowledge and skills in culturally responsive and trauma-informed teaching, classroom

management, time management, teaching strategies, and work/life balance, for a term of

twelve (12) months, for an amount not to exceed \$110,000.00.
